The UK government is hosting a crucial climate change conference in November 2021. Many scientists believe it is the last opportunity to put global policies in place to stop irreversible damage to our planet. CND calls on the government to take the threat seriously. And part of the solution is to scrap Trident, our nuclear weapons system.

End of the world?

The government remains determined to spend £205 billion on a new nuclear weapons system. But the real threat facing us today is the increase in the Earth's temperature caused by humans, which has potentially devastating consequences for our communities.

Impact of nuclear war

Nuclear weapons cause severe damage to the climate and environment on a scale incomparable to any other weapon. Research by the International Red Cross shows the effect of a 'limited' nuclear war would disrupt the global climate to such an extent that a billion people could face starvation. Invest in low-carbon future

Britain needs to reduce carbon emissions. The £205 billion cost of replacing Trident would pay to install solar panels in every home or build enough wind turbines to power all households in the UK.

Invest in low-carbon future

Trident uses massive energy and resources in research, production, operation, dismantling and eventual waste storage. Scrapping Trident is a great way to cut the UK's footprint.
